125: CHERRY CAKE RECIPE - 7" / 18cm deep cake tin

| 175g/6oz butter or margarine | 175g/6oz caster sugar |
| 3 eggs | 300g/10oz self raising flour |
| 250g/8oz halved glacé cherries | 50g/2oz ground almonds |
| 5 tablespoons milk (approx) | |

Line and grease the tin. Cream the fat and sugar together. Beat in the eggs one at a time, adding a tablespoon of the flour with the last two. Fold in the remaining flour, then the cherries and almonds and enough milk to give a dropping consistency.
Bake for 1½—2 hours at gas mark 3, 160°C / 325°F.
